**S**igned by President Franklin D. Roosevelt on February 19, 1942, Executive Order 9066 called for the incarceration of 120,000 Japanese Americans during WWII. Every year, the Japanese American community in Chicago comes together to commemorate EO9066 as a reminder of the fragility of civil liberties in times of crisis and the importance of remaining vigilant in protecting the rights and freedoms of all.

**DAY OF REMEMBRANCE 2019** features a keynote address from **KAREN KOREMATSU**, Founder and Executive Director of the **FRED T. KOREMATSU INSTITUTE** and the daughter of the late Fred T. Korematsu. Since her father's passing in 2005, Karen has carried on Fred's legacy as a civil rights advocate, public speaker and public educator. Ms. Korematsu's work extends to advocating for civil liberties for all communities, addressing current issues that draw lessons from the past.
